Ms. Beck provided an update of PTA activities and requested information concerning the hurricane shelter expenses and dress code modification.


Ms. Jablonski spoke about the Apples for Teachers program and thanked the Board for the mums that were placed outside the buildings for the first day of school.

Mr. Bostock asked about the dump truck which was purchased at the end of 10-11 but had only recently arrived. He also asked about the 125 (Cafeteria Plan) reported on by Mr. Austin and asked if the Board would consider additional maintenance for the PHS lavatories.
